

In Tribute to Romy Reyes, RIP

On Sunday, January 27, 2019, at 8:15am, just as mass was about to begin, two bombs exploded in the Cathedral of Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Jolo, Sulu, wreaking destruction, injury and death. Romulo Reyes, 58, and current President of the Parish Pastoral Council and his wife, Leah, were among the victims. A steadfast peacemaker and versatile musician, Romy had spent his life promoting a culture of peace through music. In 2000, the "Album of Peace" was produced through the collaboration of the Peace Centers of Notre Dame University, where RNDMs are in ministry, and of Notre Dame of Jolo, with funding assistance of CRS. One of the songs composed by Romy, "Children of Peace," was sung by Leah and Romy's daughter, Aubrey, 6 years old at the time. RNDMs have used the song over the years in their ministries and in community prayer. In honor of a life

dedicated to peace and cut short by violence, we offer it again now as Romy's prayer and our own:
