St. Benedict's crèche was established by Euphrasie Barbier more than 100 years ago for the care of poor and abandoned babies. Presently there are 40 children aged 0-6 years in the crèche. They are often found in front of our gate; many of them are left by single mothers who do not want to own and care for them. The sisters accept these babies, offer them a loving and secure home and provide them with basic needs.



Your gift will help to provide food, medicines, clothes, toys and education for the orphans and abandoned children.



Minh Hung Ethnic Children's Home was founded to house the indigenous children. They come from very poor families relying mainly on crops of cashew nuts giving fruits only 3-4 months per year. As a result these children are forced to drop school at an early age to help families to grow vegetables and other foods. The beneficiaries of this project are 68 children aged 6-16 who lack education and are victims of child labour. The RNDM sisters teach them the basic skills, catechism, human values and tutor them to keep up their school subjects.



Your gift will contribute to the human and intellectual development of these children and reduce child labour.



Almel is a rural village in North Karnataka where infant and maternal mortality rates are very high. The sisters started this project in 1997 for the low caste children who do not enjoy childhood as they are obliged to support their families either grazing cattle or looking after their younger siblings. The project will reach out to 30 children who will be provided with nutritious food, medical care and education. This will be inspirational to their siblings and parents and will help to reduce child labour and child marriage.
