The Mother and Child Health Care Program is an outreach activity of the Delesan Kailawan Centre run by the RNDM sisters in the Philippines. The beneficiaries are the Dulangan Manobo people, an indigenous tribe residing in Kulaman valley.

In this remote area, almost unreachable by any transport, people have no access to primary health care and women risk their lives during childbirth. The sisters, co-workers and health volunteers monitor and survey the health conditions of the mothers and children. They accompany and assist them during emergency cases, pre-natal and post-natal care.

GIVE EDUCATION FAITH AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT OF YOUTH Bidar, India South

The beneficiaries of this project are poor students and their families who come from remote villages. Each village has approximately two to three hundred households lacking access to education and information. As a result, the children are deprived of the basic right to education and cannot afford to go to school.

Responding to the needs of these people, the RNDM sisters have opened a home to welcome ethnic minority girls from these villages. The sisters believe that when we educate a woman, a family is educated; so they wish to give these girls a chance for a better life and teach them basic skills for a brighter future.



Your gift will enable these girls to have access to education and improve their standard of life.

Bidar is one of the rural districts in South India where there are issues of discrimination of women, poverty, illiteracy, unorganized youth, alcoholism, gambling and unemployment.

To improve the above situation, this project will reach out to many young people, developing their spiritual, intellectual, economic and social values. The children are encouraged to attend faith formation classes and provided with care and support including food and transportation.

The sisters work with women in the diocese of Pyay, Myanmar. Dantdalon is one of the villages where a reservoir was built around 1990. Many families were forced to move to the present location when the old village was covered with water. Many people lost their farming land and jobs and men became addicted to alcoholism. Several women have become widows and struggle to make a living.

In order to support and empower these women, the sisters wish to set up a weaving centre where the women can work and sell their products to earn an income for themselves.
