Mboro Dispensary Installs a Haematology Analyzer

A dream came true for the RNDM Sisters in Senegal when the Haematology Analyzer came for Mboro dispensary. Our aim is to offer a wide range of blood tests, including those most commonly required for pregnant women and patients needing to undergo surgery. A good number of patients who are referred from the state-run or private health centres also get the benefit of the new machine. Since its installation in June, the machine has been used for a total of **414** analysis, of which **302** of pregnant women on their first antenatal consultation. Having the machine is a great help for faster and easier diagnosis of various illnesses.

Earlier the technicians had to go to Tivaouane, 30km from Mboro, the nearest centre where such testing is possible with much delay in obtaining results. But now with the new machine, the lab technicians are able to carry out all the testing required according to the government antenatal program at our own centre. This helps in the early detection of illnesses tand helps to reduce the mortality rate during childbirth. Other patients who come to our dispensary and others referred from the state- run or private health centres in our locality, also get proper treatment at the right time.

We thank our sisters and benefactors for helping us to realize this dream. Our people in Mboro are indebted to you for your thoughtfulness and generosity. May God bless you and your families.

The most urgent needs of the school children in the Bolipara Mission were Clean drinking Water, Sanitary system, Electricity and Hygiene. Our project this year was to make a Reservoir for clean drinking water, and toilets for the students and staff.

We are grateful that this project met our greatest needs, as the children would now be free from the many diseases that they were in danger of picking up. These children walk 4/5 miles of rugged roads to school each day, and now they can refresh themselves with pure drinking water after their long journey. We are happy to give these children from remote villages a chance to study in our mission school and are satisfied that Moral values, health and hygiene are taught in order to shape the future of the children entrusted in our care.

I had lost my father in a road accident two years ago. At present we stay with my maternal uncle. My mother works in the tea garden and she gets only Rs.120 (\$ 2) per day. She is the lone breadwinner of my family. She finds it difficult to manage the expenses of the house and yet she wants to educate me and my brother. So she admitted me to St. Thomas' hostel run by the sisters.

I am very happy to stay in the hostel with many friends. I thank God for giving me this chance to study. I enjoy good health because of the good food I receive and I am able to study well. I am grateful to all the uncles and aunties who support us. I am praying for all every day and ask God to bless all of you Your laving child, Sneha Tirkey

I, Sanjukta belonging to a tribal community in Odisha. I am married and have two children. My husband is an alcoholic and I faced lots of trouble and harassment from him so I began to live on my own with my two children. The first child is a girl and she is reading in class VIII and second is a boy and he is in class V. Though the husband is working he does not support us in any way even in educating the children.

This was the time Sr. Anita Dung Dung came to my life as a beacon of light and inspired me to join the Self Help

course run by the sisters. Now, I have completed the six month's tailoring course and the sisters helped me to get a sewing machine and am now self employed. I am quite happy now because I get orders for stitching and it brings some income for our living and for the education of my children. I believe that this will help me to become self supporting in the future. I am ever grateful to God and all of you who became an instrument in changing my life. I keep you in my prayers.
