Greetings, blessings, and gratitude from your Mission Promotion Team!

Our RNDM Constitutions (above) speak to our hearts as we experience the reality of our world today. During these weeks dedicated to "Season of Creation" (1st September – 4th October), Christians around the world join in celebrating Creation and considering our role in protecting this shared home of ours. We are now more than ever aware of what happens when climate breakdown occurs on a global scale. As well as Hurricane Irma, we currently have two other hurricanes in the West Atlantic – Jose and Katia -, not to mention the destruction from hurricane Harvey. Forty million people are affected by floods in South Asia, an area without anywhere nearly the same infrastructure or resources to cope, as the richest country on earth. We remember the many victims and huge material loss in Bangladesh, India, and Nepal. The State of Bihar in NE India is immersed by violent floods with an estimated 24 million people affected, mostly from socially excluded and ecumenically poorest communities. Amidst a military campaign in Myanmar's Rakhine State, the long-persecuted Muslim Rohingya minority fled for their lives, 130,000 to Bangladesh. UN estimates that 160,000 Rohinyas remain stranded without support in the impoverished region. Bangladesh with its own poverty and flooding, cannot cope with this number of migrants. Our thoughts and prayers are with our RNDM Sisters who live and work in India, Bangladesh, and Myanmar, who do what they can to support their people in the midst of this new wave of struggle. World leaders have a huge responsibility and we continue to pray that Gospel values of justice, peace, integrity, and freedom will somehow become an important part of their agenda. Let us join with others through prayer and action as we too do our part to help alleviate suffering in our world.
