## RNDM MISSION PROMOTERS' WORKSHOP

## Mariam Nilaya Convent, Bengaluru, South India

## 3-12 April 2018

Dear Sisters and Friends,

We are thrilled to share with you our experiences on the RNDM Mission Promoters' Workshop which was held in Bengaluru, South India. We were 15 participants from 8 provinces: Rita Kyi Kyi Aung, Josephine Moses and Rita Phyo from Myanmar, Lucia Cuong from Vietnam, Anna Ngan Ha from Kenya, Purobi Chiran and David Paroi from Bangladesh, Delma Barrientos from the Philippines, FultiMary Sun from North East India. Suja Sebastian and Monica Riahtam



from India Central, Ida Wilma Fernandez, Lily Vaz and Flavy Castelino from South India. Vinitha Kurian, Province Leader also participated in the workshop.

The workshop began on the afternoon of 3<sup>rd</sup> April, with the welcome ritual by the host Province. Sister Vinitha Kurian together with the Sisters of Mariam Nilaya, Mariam Nivas, Aspirants and Novices welcomed us according to the local culture. We were honoured with the ritual of washing hands, *aarati, chandan*, garland and shawl which made us feel very special to enter into the sacred space. In procession we went to Euphrasie Hut where Sister Vinitha welcomed us officially and



shared with us a brief history of the place. A sacred South Indian dance called 'Bharatanatyam' was performed by the students of Mariam Nilaya School. From there we proceeded to the session hall, carrying the Icon of the Trinity, picture of Euphrasie and a lighted candle.



Sisters Crescencia Sun and Smitha Thomas heartily welcomed the participants to the workshop and gave the orientation of the program and we shared our hopes and expectations.

Fr. Lord Winner CMF, the Asst. General Mission Procurator, Rome was the resource person from 4-7 April. His input sessions were both theoretical and practical on Project planning using PRA tools, Logical Framework Approach, Proposal Writing and Fundraising. His presentation was very enriching as he shared with us his knowledge and expertise in this field. The training was very useful and





educative especially for those of us who are new in project writing and fundraising. We were very happy to receive resources materials like handouts, CDs and a book on Mission Project Service for our ongoing learning and practice. At the end of his course, Fr. Winner surprised us with the Certificate of Award.

The IMDO team presented on Misean Cara, the Irish funding agency that has been supporting some of the major projects in the Congregation. Carmel Terry, RNDM liaison to Misean Cara was unable to be present with us, as she was denied visa for India. We are grateful to Carmel for a very productive skype call and for sharing in detail about Misean Cara, especially on their revised forms for project application. We appreciate her support and patience in clarifying our doubts and queries.

The IMDO team also shared on the Spirituality of Fundraising and RNDM Strategic Planning that led to a dynamic group discussion and clarification. We were happy and grateful to Sister Catherine Brabender who shared at length through Skype on Vision, RNDM Strategic Planning related to projects and funding. Planning on individual projects helped us to understand the importance of making a Strategic Plan even for our daily activities.

This sessions presented by Sisters Crescencia and Smitha deepened our understanding of IMDO and its progress over the years. They explained to us clearly on the role of Mission Promoter, RNDM Solidarity Funding and Christmas Catalogue, Child Sponsorship, School Partnership, RNDM Volunteers, the importance of Child Safeguarding Policy,

Accountability and Transparency in all funding related
activities.
