# To All the Sisters in the Congregation

## Dear Sisters

Loving greetings to you. Since the wonderful feast of Easter, there have been some extraordinary events in the world and particularly in the Church. We were deeply saddened by the death of Pope Francis on the day after Easter Sunday. He had appeared in St Peter's piazza on Easter Sunday showing that no matter his state of health he wanted to be with the people. He has left us a great example and legacy of humility, care and compassion for the poor and the deeply personal call in Laudato Si to be active protagonists of ecological conversion. "The cry of the poor is the cry of the earth."



After the outpouring of sadness and grief for Pope Francis, we followed the days of the conclave with a deep sense of prayer for those involved to be attentive to the whisperings and voice of the Holy Spirit. Late in the afternoon of 8 May, white smoke appeared and the new Pope appeared on the balcony taking the name of Pope Leo XIV. Being an Augustinian, we feel a certain connection with the new Pope. We pray for him as he begins his leadership of the Catholic Church and that he continues to work for justice for all, to speak out for those downtrodden and unheard, to inspire us to be faithful and enthusiastic disciples of Jesus and to be a

I attended the UISG Plenary Assembly with about 900 Congregation Leaders from 5-9 May. It is an enriching experience which always reminds me that as religious women we have the power for such good. Sr Simona Brambilla, MC, gave a very thought provoking presentation which has been shared with you via email. As we prepare for our Congregation Chapter and discuss **RNDM Mission** - **Presence of Hope**, there is much to inspire us in the presentation and the images of sun and moon that Sr Simona has written about as well as the work of Simeon and Anna. I encourage you to spend time in reflecting on her presentation. Consecrated life can be a transforming hope. How do we participate in that transformation?

Sr Simona also refers to the *Final Document* on Synodality which states that: "Consecrated life is called to challenge the Church and society with its prophetic voice. Across their centuries-long history, the various forms of consecrated life elaborated what we now recognize as practices of

synodal living. These include how to practice discernment in common and to harmonise together individual gifts as well as pursue mission in common...Today, many communities of consecrated life are like laboratories for inter-cultural living in a way that is prophetic for both the Church and the world."<sup>1</sup>

We cannot do this alone. We need the Spirit who fills us with transforming love, peace and hope. May our hearts be open and ever attentive. May our giving be generous. Come Holy Spirit! Come Holy Spirit!
