Some Actions

Have a supply of water for birds and insects. Water stress is one of the biggest killers of wild-life during drought. Put a dish of water out and you will help to keep all kinds of wildlife hydrated. Insects, small mammals, birds and even cats and foxes who wander through our garden will benefit.

Putting a stone in a plant saucer will help bees to perch and drink without drowning.

Avoid cutting your grass. Keeping grass long will help retain moisture, provide a source of shelter for insects and mammals.
