Peace with Creation in the Jubilee Year - Pilgrims of Hope

On the occasion of the **Season of Creation 2025**, St. Mary's Community, Shillong gathered to celebrate with prayer and reflection on the theme "*Peace with Creation*", closely tied to the Jubilee Year's call to be "*Pilgrims of Hope*."

The celebration began with a symbolic **centrepiece**: a living plant surrounded by elements of creation — a candle (the light of Christ), water (the source of life), the Bible (the Word of God), and a Cushion (rest and silence). These symbols expressed the 4 Rs of the Jubilee pilgrimage: Return, Release, Restore, and Rest.



Through scripture readings, reflections, and symbolic gestures, the community was invited to:

- **Return** to God, to our first love, and to a simpler way of living in harmony with creation.
- Release burdens such as grudges, selfishness, and wasteful habits, embracing forgiveness and ecological responsibility.
- **Restore** relationships, our mission, and the woundedness of creation, committing to healing and renewal.
- **Rest** in God and in creation, learning from nature's rhythms to pause, encounter, and be renewed.

A significant moment was the invitation for each sister to make a **personal resolution** and share it with the smaller group, then pray for one another for the grace to live out the resolutions and the fruit of the heart. This was followed by a **community resolution**, in which we collectively committed ourselves to the following:

### Return

- As a community, we will return to a simpler lifestyle, reducing unnecessary expenses.
- As a community, we will return to communal prayer with greater faithfulness and depth.

# Release

- As a community, we will release negative speech, criticism, or gossip, choosing instead to encourage one another.
- As a community, we will release wasteful habits and adopt more eco-friendly practices (segregating waste, reducing plastic, conserving water).

# Restore

- As a community, we will restore our environment by planting trees, maintaining a small garden, or adopting a local eco-initiative.
- As a community, we will restore broken relationships by practising dialogue, reconciliation, and fraternal correction in charity.
- As a community, we will restore our mission focus by reaching out to people living in poverty, children, or marginalised with renewed zeal.

# Rest

• As a community, we will slow down the pace of our activities, valuing presence and prayer as much as work and mission.

The celebration concluded with a blessing and prayer of thanksgiving, entrusting our lives and mission to the Triune God, source of creation and hope.

Through this prayerful encounter, we experienced the Jubilee call to be **Pilgrims of Hope** — consecrated women walking in faith, living our vows as a witness of peace, and journeying in harmony with creation, our common home.
